When tree surgeon Laura discovers her twin sister's commemorative oak is dying, she returns to their childhood home seeking the threads of connection. Here she must repair broken bonds with her estranged brother Joe before she can say goodbye to Eloise.

LONG SYNOPSIS

The Arborist is a story about how profoundly painful, difficult and necessary it is to accept the death of a loved one – how grief remains deeply embedded within us forever and can reawaken. At these times, how do we learn to live with it again?

Raw emotion overwhelms Laura when she realises her sister's tree is dying and the story is driven by her struggle to accept its loss... The death of the only living thing that connects her to her twin.



For Laura, the tree is a powerful conduit to the trauma of the past: the moment of her sister's death. Its decline throws her into turmoil and she retreats into memory in search of solace – to the objects and shared moments that connect her to her twin.



Laura must repair the broken bonds with her older brother Joe – through forgiveness and the beginnings of reconciliation – before she can accept the loss of the tree and the death of her sister. The felling of the tree marks the end of the hold that unresolved grief, resentment and nostalgia have over Laura. She can begin again.

DIRECTOR STATEMENT

The Arborist is a semi-autobiographical film that draws from my own experience of losing my twin and places it within a fictional context. It has elements of real life – for example, the memorial tree in the film is genuine – and it's also an act of imagination. When I was 21 years old, I lost my twin sister Eli suddenly. Her death was devastating and I was completely powerless in the face of overwhelming grief. I longed for answers, which she could never give... to say goodbye. We planted an oak tree for Eli and sprinkled her ashes among its roots. I wrote and directed *The Arborist* to make sense of Eli's loss and to explore the healing role that objects, shared stories and memories play in connecting us to the dead and to each other, and in making the terrible

irreversibility of death bearable. I wanted to invite audiences into this most intimate, devastatingly human experience – creating a sensory cinematic world through composition, colour, atmosphere, music, sound design and visually expressive storytelling. And by allowing the actors' performances to reveal the depth of emotion: the power of forgiveness and reconciliation.


Despite the tragedy at its core, my hope is that audiences feel emotionally and visually rewarded by watching *The Arborist*. Through Laura and Joe's story, we learn that, sometimes, to forgive the ones we love, we must let go of the ones we've lost.

CLARE STURGES, writer and director

Clare is a BAFTA Award-winning director drawn to intimate stories that speak to our shared humanity. Her documentary work has explored themes including end of life care, sexwork, the arts in residential care, relationships and love for people with learning disabilities and the personal impacts of terrorism. It has screened at international festivals including Ireland's Oscar-qualifying Foyle Film Festival, London Short Film Festival, Los Angeles Women's Independent Film Festival, London's East End Film Festival and the Women's International Film Festival in Hollywood. It has found international distribution through ABC Australia, DVD release and iTunes.

The Arborist is Clare's first narrative short.

Clare is the recipient of a Diverse Cymru bursary in partnership with Screen Skills and the High-end TV Levy Fund and private training grants to support her development as a director of scripted work. In 2015 Clare won the BAFTA Cymru Breakthrough Award for her documentary Sexwork Love & Mr Right. In 2016 she won the BAFTA Cymru Short Film Award for My Brief Eternity, in collaboration with Like An Egg. My Brief Eternity was also longlisted for a British Independent Film Award in 2016 and the EE BAFTA for British Short Film 2017.





KEIRAN MCGAUGHEY, producer


