jordan's story

Jordan is a delightful, cheeky teenager with a keen sense of mischief and a spontaneous laugh.

Early in his life, Jordan was diagnosed with Lennox-Gastaut syndrome – a life-limiting condition that means he has seizures and may fall suddenly.

When Jordan's mum Cerys was referred to $T\hat{y}$ Hafan, they were living in a tiny, un-adapted house. There was a constant battle to make the home safe enough for him to play and freely move around.

Working with other professionals, our Family Support team campaigned for over a year to address the family's housing needs. Jordan and his family now live in a three-bedroom spacious bungalow, with a large enclosed garden, that meets his needs.

As well as the family receiving help from Family Support, Jordan looks forward to regular visits from our Outreach Play Practitioner, with her bag of tricks. He also enjoys his stays at the hospice. This gives mum the chance to have a much-needed break from the stresses that caring for a disabled child can bring.

Working with you and professionals involved in your child's care, we will assess your child's individual needs and create a comprehensive care package. The whole family will be taken into consideration with the main aim to improve quality of life for everyone.

We are able to deliver an excellent standard of care through qualified and trained staff. These include children's nurses, social workers and play workers. We are monitored by Healthcare Inspectorate Wales under regulations set by legislation, through annual and unannounced inspections.
